(January 25, 2022) – Regina, SK – The Saskatchewan Science Centre, with support from the Government of Saskatchewan’s Status of Women Office, is excited to present the **Girls In STEAM 2022 Conference on February 11th, 2022.**

This **free virtual event** is open to girls in grades 6 to 9 and is an opportunity for youth to meet women working in science, technology, engineering, arts, and math (STEAM) fields, gain new skills, and have a lot of fun with hands-on activities.

Individuals can register to attend on their own, or teachers can register their entire classroom (including mixed gender classrooms) to attend. Each successful registrant or classroom will receive a kit of science activities to explore during and after the event.

A keynote speech by famed Canadian science communicator Science Sam (Dr. Samantha Yamine) will be followed by breakout sessions with notable Saskatchewan women who will share their experiences in industries including engineering, architecture, coding, and natural sciences.

“The goal of the Girls in STEAM 2022 Conference is to highlight the achievements of Saskatchewan women in scientific fields,” explains Sandy Baumgartner, CEO of the Saskatchewan Science Centre. “These mentors will introduce STEAM careers to the next generation of our province’s women, and inspire them to pursue careers in these important fields.”
