

Saskatchewan Science Centre Turns Summer Up to 11

(April 4, 2018) – Regina, SK – The Saskatchewan Science Centre announced today plans for a toe-tapping summer full of music. Opening at the Centre on the May long weekend will be a Rock 'n Roll themed exhibition called *Rock U: The Institute of Rock and Roll*. It will be matched up with a brand new IMAX film titled *America's Musical Journey*.

"Rock U takes interactivity and cranks it up to 11," says Sandy Baumgartner, CEO of the Saskatchewan Science Centre. "This visiting exhibition will be a must-see for the people of Saskatchewan during the summer of 2018." Featuring real instruments guests can play, important pieces of musical history, and dozens of fun, challenging interactives, *Rock U* will help every visitor find their inner soloist.

America's Musical Journey, by the award-winning MacGillivray Freeman Films, recently premiered to rave reviews at the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum and will now be available to the people of Saskatchewan at the Kramer IMAX Theatre. Following musician Aloe Blacc as he traces musical history through iconic cities such as New Orleans, Chicago, Detroit, Nashville, Miami, and more, America's Musical Journey shows how much of today's popular music can be traced back to simple roots in our past.

Also announced is the return of **24 Hours of Science**, presented by SaskCentral. **24 Hours of Science** premiered in 2017 as the Science Centre stayed open for 24 consecutive hours filled with programming, entertainment, and special activities such as sunrise yoga, a family dance party, and all night long science demonstrations. Expanded for 2018, **24 Hours of Science** promises to be an amazing way to kick off the Canada Day long weekend.
